The area around our school is busy and potentially hazardous during the peak morning and afternoon drop off and pick up period. Your cooperation and patience when using the Kiss & Drive facility will provide your children with a safer, less stressful environment.

Five bays on Creaney Drive have been designated as the Kiss & Drive area and are only for the set-down and pick up of students. This process allows more vehicles to use the same bays in the peak periods before and after school.

Kiss & Drive zones typically allow parents to pick up and drop off children close to the main school entrance. These spaces are not to be used for parking.

Please familiarise yourself with the following rules:

How the Kiss & Drive works:

- Move as near to the front of the Kiss & Drive bays as possible. Keep moving forward to let other cars join from behind you
- Always be courteous to other road users
- Children will wait at Kiss & Drive until you have safely pulled in
- If your child is not ready at Kiss & Drive when you arrive don't stop, continue along Creaney Drive, turn left onto Kingsley Drive and go around the block before joining the queue again
- There is no parking permitted in pick up bays
- Always indicate to enter and leave the Kiss & Drive bays
- Ensure children entering the vehicle put on their seat belt before moving off

Morning

- Stop in Kiss & Drive bays (use forward most bays)
- Students alight from left of vehicle (onto footpath)
- Parents/carers must remain in vehicle
- When students are clear of vehicle, indicate right and enter traffic flow safely
- If there are no free bays on arrival, please do not block traffic. Instead, travel along Creaney Drive, turn left at Kingsley Drive and go around the block
- Do not use the staff carpark
- If you have to get out of the car to organise your child, Kiss & Drive may not be a suitable option for your family. In this case, please park safely in one of the designated bays around our school

Afternoon

- Only enter Kiss & Drive area if your child/ren are ready to be picked up. It may be wise to give your child some time to get to the Kiss & Drive area before coming to collect them
- If your child is not ready, don't stop continue along Creaney Drive, turn left at Kingsley Drive and go around the block before rejoining the queue
- If there are no free bays, please do not block the traffic. Instead, follow the directions above
- Encourage your child to wait safely, look out for you and wait until you are stopped before attempting to get into the car
- Move as near to the front of the Kiss & Drive bays as possible. Keep moving forward to let other cars join from behind you

PLEASE NOTE:

- IF YOU HAVE A CHILD IN KINDY OR PRE-PRIMARY PLEASE DO NOT USE THE KISS & DRIVE
- NO PARKING IN THE STAFF CAR PARK ON CREANEY DRIVE
- NO U-TURNS DO NOT DO U-TURNS IN OUR BUSY SCHOOL ZONE ON CREANEY DRIVE. THEY ARE DANGEROUS AND PUT CHILDREN AT RISK. PLEASE DRIVE AROUND THE BLOCK.

Good parkers DO


- Leave the car at home (if possible)
- Park the vehicle further away and walk
- Obey all street signage
- Consider other road users
- Use the assigned parking bays
- Cooperate with other parents to take turns dropping off and picking up children at school

Good parkers DO NOT

- Park on the footpaths
- Park on verges without permission
- Park in the Kiss & Drive
- Park blocking a driveway
- Park within 10m of an intersection
- Park contrary to any street signage
- Park facing against the flow of traffic
- Receive parking infringements

Creaney Primary School has plenty of available parking in and around the school grounds. The following locations are available for longer term parking (map below):

- Kingsley Drive (parallel parking)
- Creaney Drive (parallel parking)
- Kingsley Park (across the oval)
- Kingsley Clubrooms
- ESC Long term parking (not staff car park)



Infringements

If you do not park in accordance with the parking requirements, you may receive a parking infringement from the City of Joondalup.

- Stopping in a No Stopping area
- Stopping or parking in front of a driveway
- Double parking
- Stopping of parking on any footpath or cycleway
- Parking on a verge without consent
- Causing an obstruction
- Unauthorised parking in ACROD BAYS

City Officers will conduct patrols near schools throughout the year to reinforce correct parking and increase safety for children attending school.
